## OUR MISSION MAHAVIDYALAYA

Vivekananda Mission Mahavidyalaya is an eminent college located in the district of Purba Medinipur in the state of West Bengal. It has earned its reputation through continuous development since its modest beginning on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 1968.

Many years earlier our Mission Mahavidyalaya was established by the monks, brahmacharies and philanthropists of the Vivekananda Mission Ashram to especially cater to the needs of the sons and daughters of the soil. Our Mission Mahavidyalaya has always been particularly sensitive to the specific requirements of the students of the surrounding areas; and has been mindful of accommodating their special interests without compromising on the high standards of education being provided to them. Under the able guidance of our new principal, Dr. Manabendra Sahu, our Mission Mahavidyalaya is continuing the progress towards academic excellence and personality development of its students.

In the beginning, classes of the Mahavidyalaya were held at two neighboring institutions set up by the Vivekananda Mission Ashram namely Rampur Vivekananda Mission Vidyamandir and Bajitpur Saradamani Balika Vidyalyaya. However, in the year 1970 classes and the office of the Mahavidyalaya shifted to its own building.

In course of time the college gradually expanded. Initially six lecturers were appointed to teach different humanities subjects. Within two years approval to open Commerce stream was accorded to the college. Gradually, the College expanded to introduce more Honours Subjects.

In addition to the expansion in our undergraduate courses, currently, we offer post graduation in Bengali, Philosophy and History. Since 2015, our college has been granted autonomy with respect to the post graduate courses.

Along with imparting higher education in the regular mode, the College has also been involved in distance mode education. It has been running a Study Centre (I-03) of Netaji Subhas Open University since July, 2017. The Study Centre has affiliation for the following courses.

1. Bachelor's Degree Programme (BDP): Duration-3 Years.
2. Post –Graduate Course (PG)-2 Years
3. Bachelor of Library and Information Science (BLIS): Duration – 1 Year.

The Mahavidyalaya has maintained a high standard in teaching. The effect: a consistent record of satisfactory academic results. Students has consistently scored first class marks in various disciplines. All these make the college confident of a promising future.

The location of the Mahavidyalaya is a convenient one as it stands just beside the Balughata-Kukrahati Road and is adjacent to Vivekananda Mission Ashram. It is well connected by rail and bus routes. The nearest railway station is Barda on the Haldia-Panskura route. Moreover, the college is only a few minutes' walk from Chaitanyapur crossing.

### Principal with his Non-Teaching Staff **Infrastructure**

Vivekananda Mission Mahavidyalaya has approximately 3.42 acres of land. Although the area at our disposal has always been inadequate for our aspirations, we have also been able to utilize the space optimally. As a result, our College has made significant infrastructural developments in the last few years. The college believes that all these will go a long way into making the institute a preferred choice for students who aspire for value based education.

- ❖ The campus area has been extended sufficiently for a building to conduct post graduation classes. The building will be constructed from funds acquired under the RUSA scheme.
- ❖ Hostel facilities are available in the vicinity of the college 'KALPANA CHAWLA HALL' for female students and 'VIDYASAGAR CHHATRABAS' for male students.
- ❖ The library building is built up to the second floor.
- ❖ A cycle-stand is constructed for the benefit of the students.
- ❖ The approach road to the college has been transformed into a pucca-road and soon it will be illuminated with vapour-lamps with grants from Haldia Development Authority.
- ❖ The college ground is big enough to host not only football matches but also athletic events.
- ❖ The Students' Union is allowed to use two rooms. One of the rooms is given to the students for indoor sports like table-tennis and carom.
- ❖ The boys and girls of the college have their respective common rooms with basic amenities.
- ❖ A smart class is provided for taking audio-visual classes on the 1st floor of the Library Building.
- ❖ A virtual classroom has been built for video-conferences and online interaction with reputed institutes.
- ❖ Well equipped laboratory facilities are provided for Pure Science, Bio Science and Computer Science departments.
- ❖ A separate seminar hall is provided for conducting various meetings, conference, workshops and seminars.
- ❖ Dedicated computers are provided to each and every department.
- ❖ A dedicated Commerce computer lab is provided for Computer Applications.
- ❖ The college has a multi-gym jointly donated by the Govt. of West Bengal and the Youth and Sports Dept., Govt. of India. The Physical Education Department takes care of the Gym related activities of the students. A Yoga-training centre is also presently attached with the Gymnasium.
- ❖ The canteen of our Mission Mahavidyalaya has been updated over the years to serve the teachers, staff and students of the college at a subsidized rate. Now, the canteen is a spacious one with separate enclosures for male, female students and the college staff.

## Examination Structure

Under CBCS (Choice Based Credit system), the under-graduate courses (Honours/General) are of six semesters in three years – two semesters in each year. The details of the exam-structure are given below:

**SEMESTER (1<sup>ST</sup> /2<sup>ND</sup> /3<sup>RD</sup> /4<sup>TH</sup> /5<sup>TH</sup> /6<sup>TH</sup>) SYSTEM EXAM. PATTERN FOR B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. HONOURS COURSE  
CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM – CBCS**

Students of B.A./B. Com./B.Sc. Honours Course have to study 14 Core Courses/Papers. In addition, they have to select 04 Generic Courses (02 papers each) of different 02 Generic Subjects respectively in different Four semesters. Example : GE-ABC Paper-I in 1<sup>st</sup> Sem. GE-ABC Paper-II in 2<sup>nd</sup> Sem., GE-XYZ Paper-III in 3<sup>rd</sup> Sem., GE-XYZ Paper-IV in 4<sup>th</sup> Sem.) and different 02 AECC Course in different Two semesters (Bengali/English/Hindi/ Communication in 1<sup>st</sup> Sem. And Environmental Studies in 2<sup>nd</sup> Sem.), 02 SEC Courses (related with Hons. Subject) in different Two semesters and 04 DSE Courses (related with Hons. Subject) in different Two semesters during three years.

### Rules for Admission

Instructions for the Students Regarding Online Admission:

1. For Online Admission, the students first need to access the website (<http://vmmahavidyalaya.ac.in/>). On our website they will find the Portal created exclusively for Online Admission.

- ❖ The first step on their part will be to register themselves online through the Admission Portal.
- ❖ The next step will be to fill the Personal Details followed by Academic Details.
- ❖ Once they successfully submit these details, they will be directed to the Payment options. There are two ways by which the payment can be made by the students—
  - They can make online payment; or
  - They might choose the manual payment option- they need to generate and print the pay slip for making the manual payment and carry out the payment process accordingly.
- ❖ The students at this stage are required to print their filled up form, which will be generated in PDF format by the system and submit the form online.
- ❖ They need to follow the updates on our website regularly for the declaration of Merit Lists.

2. The next steps pertaining to Online Admission are only for the students selected for admission:

For the counseling session, the students must carry the following:

- ❖ Printed forms safely with their full signature and their recent passport size photograph in the designated space.
- ❖ The self-attested photocopies of all their certificates and mark sheets.
- ❖ The second copy of the pay slip used for making the manual payment.
- ❖ One extra passport size photo.
- ❖ Their original certificates and mark sheets, which will be verified by the College authorities.

Once the Counseling Process is over, the students will be sent to the Bank with a Challan from the college office, for deposition of the necessary Admission Fees.



## Attendance

Regular attendance of students in classes is strictly maintained. Students with attendance below 60% become dis-collegiate while students with attendance between 75% and 60% are called non-collegiate Guardians of students with low attendance are called up periodically to ensure better attendance of their wards.

The Psychological Counseling Cell provides mental support to the students and helps them to fight depression and other related problems.




## General Instruction
